BARLOW, Rt. Hon. Sir MONTAGU (1870 - ); barrister  
of Lincoln Inn. Part. Sec., Min. of Labour 1920-2; <sup>P.C. 1922!</sup> Minister of Labour T.P.C.  
1922-~~24~~. M.P. <sup>(Cons.)</sup> So. Salford 1910-8, 1918-22, 1922-Dec. 1933.  
Conservative.

6. 5. 1870; s. of Barlow ( ) Head of 'Pelewton'  
by ; in 1934 Doris Louise Freed, late deputy  
Administrator Women's Royal Air Force. Educ. Repton (Head of  
School) and Kings, Camb. (1<sup>st</sup> class Law, Whewell Scholar, Forke  
University Prize Essay). Called to bar Lincoln's Inn, 1895; & practised  
mainly in educational & charity cases; examiner in Law, London  
Univ. Served on London County Council as a Municipal Reformers  
E. Islington 1907-10. Director or Chairman of Sottery's 1909-28.  
In the war he raised, clothed & equipped the 5<sup>th</sup> Salford Battalion. <sup>K.B.E. 1918</sup>  
He was started on Conservative politics by his father's example, by  
debating at Repton and at the Cambridge Union, influenced by  
Macauley's Essays at school and Pericles' great speech in the  
2<sup>nd</sup> book of Thucydides; and <sup>he read</sup> the Times. <sup>Barlow Sir Montagu</sup> He is a strong upholder  
of Christianity and the Church of England. <sup>as he</sup> ~~Barlow~~ had a good  
income two or three; Parliament seemed interesting; He was  
put in touch with 3 constituencies in 1909. Helected the Salford  
seat. His elections cost £800 to £900 and £500 a year; and on  
joining the ~~cons~~ government he had to give up directorships. He got a  
baronetcy on entering the Cabinet, 1924.  
He enjoyed most, unlike anybody else, his close relations with his  
constituents, and promoting unemployment insurance while in office.  
He liked best his first speech as Minister of Labour, "on which I  
received the public congratulations of the leaders of the Opposition, Mr. H. H.  
Asquith". And his best piece of work, apart from his services as  
Minister & Part. Sec., was securing a suitable and unambiguous  
report from <sup>the</sup> Select Com. on Pension Scales and Administration  
over which he presided. He has written: - Essays on Church Reform,  
Education Acts 1902-3, Barlow Family Record, &c. His recreations  
are rowing, fishing, golf, shooting, ~~and~~ and all manly sports.  
Yet after he left office he became director of many companies.

BARLOW, RT.HON. Sir (CLEMENT ANDERSON) MONTAGU;
